Spaces available for \$25 for Historic Yorkshire Neighborhood residents / \$35 for sellers from outside the neighborhood.

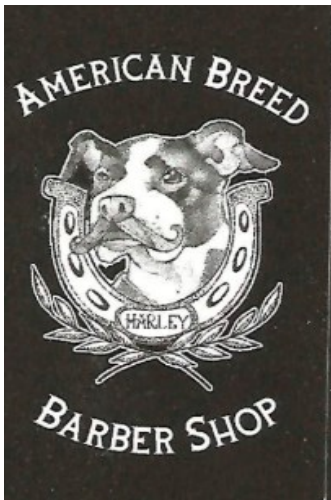

Up to three 10-x-7 inch bronze, oval plaques per year will be awarded to homeowners in the Historic Yorkshire neighborhood, who are willing to research and trace the origins of their homes through deeds and records back to the year they were built. Plaques can also be purchased without the background research for \$200; ordering information can be obtained from Harry as well.
